

Course Description:

7th Grade Language Arts is a full year course focusing on reading

Goals: Students will demonstrate their ability to read challenging complex texts closely and cite examples of specific evidence to support their claims. They will be able to recognize the connection between setting, plot, and characters, and provide a summary of a text.

#### Dear Parent/Guardian,

Hello, my name is MaryAnn Troutman. I am the seventh grade math teacher and I have the opportunity to help your child enrich his/her math knowledge in my class this year. Although this will be a challenging year in many ways, I am confident that your child will have a successful year in math class.

I am asking that your child bring in a binder/folder whenever you are able to acquire one. If you are not able, please have your child ask me for one. Your child will also need a supply of pencils. You can purchase a ruler, protractor, and a compass, but these are NOT mandatory; some students have even purchased their own calculator. If you do so, I suggest TI-34 Multiview by Texas Instruments. They are available on Amazon for about \$20.

I expect that your child will bring the following materials to class daily:

- Digits Companion paper book (! refer to as their WORKBOOK)
- planner/agenda
- ½ inch or 1 inch binder to keep work (a folder is okay)
- pencils (with erasers)
- completed assignment(whether done online, textbook or worksheet review)

Students will possibly have a daily assignment; they should get most of that assignment completed in class if they are working diligently. They are required to show work in solving the assigned problems, using the binder/folder to store their work. If your child has a question on any of the problems please encourage him/her to ask for help. There is no shame in asking for help, this is one way in which we learn. The marking period grades will be based on classwork/homework, quizzes, and tests.

All seventh grade students will be using the Pearson Digits series. Your child will have his/her own login and password for the digits site. You are more than welcome to ask for this information and check online as to your child's progress. Their folders will show what is "Not Started," "In Progress," and "Completed." If the date shown is RED that means the assignment(s) is past due. Do note however, this is not necessarily his/her grade as the weight of grades maybe different.

Your involvement is very important. It is crucial that your child complete each day's assignment. You can expect your child to complete four to five lessons per week. Please ask to see your child's daily assignment, and encourage him/her to complete all the work. Students who complete all the daily assignments will have much to be proud of at test time.

Learning mathematics is similar to learning a foreign language, a musical instrument, or an athletic skill. Becoming proficient requires long-term practice to develop and maintain mastery of the problem-solving skills needed for success in math-intensive disciplines.

Your child's experience in math will be a direct result of his/her attitude and effort. A positive attitude and a commitment to long-term practice greatly improve the chances of your child progressing at a steady rate. Through our combined efforts your child can experience success at this level and learn the foundational skills needed for the next level.



A Science related Current Event is due every other Friday and must be turned in on time.





#### Dear Parent/Guardian:

In seventh grade English, your student will maintain a Writer's Notebook. We will be writing in this notebook at the beginning of class several times a week. The notebook your child procures for class can be a regular single subject notebook, marbled composition book (my personal preference), or something even fancier if your child prefers it. Rather than storing this notebook in their lockers, students should keep these notebooks in labeled bins located in my classroom. It would be a nightmare for a student to lose their Writer's Notebook, since that is where they will store their brainstorming and pre-writing activities. Those brainstorms and ideas are the mandatory jumping point to participating in the class's Writing Workshop.

Starting with the second week of school, we find a daily routine in English class. The first ten minutes of class kick off with a bellringer, and several a week will consist of what we will call Sacred Writing Time (SWT). SWT is guaranteed, regardless of whether or not I am here, and quiet. To be better writers, you have to write or review writing every day. SWT reiterates this idea and gives us (your student AND myself) the opportunity to practice our writing skills on a daily basis. Think about it – by the end of the week, your child will have practiced writing for almost an hour. That has the potential for a lot of growth!

I believe students become more engaged in their compositions if they are writing about something they really enjoy or are interested in. Therefore, I will be encouraging your child to write about their likes, experiences, and dreams. Your student won't be the only one writing, either. SWT is something in which I will also participate, using my own brainstorms to demonstrate how to develop ideas from a Writer's Notebook into rough drafts and, eventually, final drafts.

We will begin using our Writer's Notebooks during the second week of school, so please make sure your super student has a notebook ready to be transformed into a winning Writer's Notebook.

## Seventh Grade English Syllabus Line Mountain Middle School 2020 - 2021



Welcome to seventh grade and to what I know will be an exciting year of English! Throughout the year, we will be studying a variety of topics, including literature, grammar, vocabulary, writing styles, listening skills, public speaking, and creative thinking.

### **Course Overview**

Seventh grade English is a full year course focused on developing reading, writing, and oral communication skills. We will develop comprehension and interpretation skills through analysis of both fiction and non-fiction. We will also work on creative, narrative, informative, and persuasive modes of writing. Grammar and vocabulary will also be studied extensively.

#### **Text**

Each student will be issued the following textbooks: Prentice Hall Literature; Timeless Voices, Timeless Themes and Sadlier Vocabulary Workshop Level B - Common Core Enriched Edition.

Supplementary text and other media will be used at the teacher's discretion.

### **Student Expectations**

#### Students will:

- Complete all assignments in a timely manner.
- Attend class regularly.
- Be prompt.
- Be prepared to work.
- Pay attention.
- Be respectful.
- Stay on task.

### **Weekly Class Schedule**

Monday: vocabulary cards made in class Wednesday: vocabulary homework due Thursday: vocabulary flip book due

Friday: vocabulary test, vocabulary cards turned in prior to test for bonus points

Daily: Bell ringer completed during the first few minutes of class. This will be sacred writing time,

journaling, or a grammar rule exercise.

#### **Materials Needed**

• twin pocket portfolio folder or binder (for handouts; this will be turned in several times throughout the year for points; you may also use an expandable file folder if you wish)

- one subject notebook or composition paper for writing, note-taking, and other classroom activities
- one subject notebook (for the Writing and Definitions Notebook preferably a marble Composition notebook but any one subject notebook will work)
- index cards (Several packs; we use index cards for key terms and vocabulary cards.)
- pens, pencils (<u>IF YOU USE NECHANICAL PENCILS</u>, <u>YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR HAVING EXTRA LEAD</u>), and erasers
- highlighter

### **Homework Policy**

I do not assign homework. We always have time in class to complete assignments. If students do not finish the work in class, they will then need to complete the work at home. Sometimes a long-term assignment may need completed over the weekend.

Late work is unacceptable. However, I do understand that sometimes things happen. Each student will be given one Late Homework Pass for each marking period. By using this pass, you avoid having any lateness points docked from your assignment if you turn in the assignment the next day with this pass attached. Once you use your pass for the marking period, any late assignments will have points docked. There are a few assignments given throughout the year where I do not permit the use of the Late Homework Pass. Students will be informed up front whether or not they may use their late pass on a particular assignment.

Points will be taken from work that is more than one day late (example: grammar worksheet) <u>Please note that some homework, such as grammar worksheets or literature questions, that is reviewed in class the day it is due will **NOT** be accepted late; it will be a zero. **Vocabulary work will only be accepted up to one week late. After that, I will no longer accept it.** If there is an extraneous amount of homework being missed overall, a new homework policy will be implemented.</u>

### **Extra Credit Policy**

I do not permit individual extra credit or bonus point work, so please do not ask me permission to do so. There are weekly opportunities for students to earn bonus points by turning in their vocabulary flash cards for bonus points on test days. Additionally, literature tests usually contain bonus questions as well.

### Absence Policy

You are responsible for making up classwork and homework when you are absent. You should talk to a classmate or the teacher immediately following your absence. If you miss a test, quiz, or project presentation, you must make it up the next day you come to school after your absence. It is YOUR job to find out what you missed and make it up as soon as possible.

On the designated bulletin board are folders for each class. If you are absent and there are handouts, I will make sure there are copies in the folder for you when you return. Please still check with a classmate or teacher to make sure you didn't miss any notes, a grammar rules bell ringer, or anything else of importance.

### Other Classroom Expectations

#### Students will:

- Seek permission before leaving assigned seats
- Seek permission to speak in class
- Be respectful of classroom and personal property
- Use only pencils or pens with blue or black ink on all assignments and tests unless otherwise noted repeated offenses can lead to points being deducted!
- Refrain from using the waste can as a basketball hoop

- Refrain from chewing gum, eating food, or drinking beverages
- Have their assignment books/hall passes with them at all times

### Staying Informed

I utilize two different tools to keep you up-to-date on class work. The first is via an app called Remind. Information on how to sign up for your class period's reminders are detailed on another handout. Through this app, you will receive text reminders about class work and other announcements.
